


# BY EMMY

# Michelle's Fresh Tomato Cream Soup

(Adapted from Williams-Sonoma Kitchen Library Soups, 1993) Serves 16-20 people

At the height of summertime, this recipe calls for bright red, juicy homegrown tomatoes, Thanks to a generous donation this month, we were able to serve this hearty lunch along with grilled cheese sandwiches. Our director, Rose, broke a decade's long aversion to tomato soup-- and even came back for seconds!

You will need a pot of boiling water and an ice bath for blanching the tomatoes' (this makes them easy to peel.) You also need a blender or food processor for pureeing the hot soup, prior to adding the cream.

### Ingredients:

½ cup unsalted butter
1 large red onion, finely chopped
8 pounds ripe tomatoes, peeled and roughly chopped
8 cup chicken stock

I tsp dried thyme 2 cups cream Salt and pepper to taste Fresh basil for garnish (optional) 3 cups breadcrumbs

#### **Directons:**

In a large pot, sauté the onion in the butter for 2-3 minutes. Add chopped tomatoes, stock, thyme. Bring to boil, reduce heat, and simmer for 30 minutes.

Stir in breadcrumbs. Then, working in small batches, puree the hot mixture in a blender or food processor, being careful to avoid splatters. Return to pan, stir and add cream, and warm thoroughly over low heat.

Season with salt and pepper. NOTE: if any bitterness is detected, the addition of a small amount of baking soda will neutralize the acid.
